Rabbinic Reflections

What is Your Mitzvah of the Month?

There are many mitzvot (commandments) in our Jewish tradition. The number 613 is often quoted as the number of mitzvot in the Torah, though some apply only in specific situations and many are not applicable today. However, there are many mitzvot that still apply and guide us in our everyday lives.

In our Religious School, we have been focusing on a “Mitzvah of the Month.” In September our “Mitzvah of the Month” was the shofar. We blow the shofar during the month of Elul leading up to Rosh Hashanah, on Rosh Hashanah itself, and at the end of Yom Kippur. The shofar is blown with three basic sounds (tekiah, shevarim, and teruah), but it has many different meanings and conveys many different messages to those who hear it.

In October, our “Mitzvah of the Month” was hachnassat orchim (hospitality). The Sukkah is a place to invite people in to share the celebration of the holiday. The Sukkah also reminds us of the significance of hospitality as we invite those from our national and personal past (known as Ushpizin) to join us spiritually in the Sukkah even as they are no longer able to join us physically. Our students had the opportunity to visit three sukkot as part of the holiday celebration. We also participated in the mitzvah of hospitality by sharing food with others in need. We helped to carry the food collected at the synagogue in the Cans for Kol Nidre project from the synagogue lobby to the cars of people from the First Baptist of Church of Laurelton who run a food pantry for anyone in need. We became partners with them in this important effort. Temple Beth Or will be collecting nonperishable food throughout the year in order to continue to
