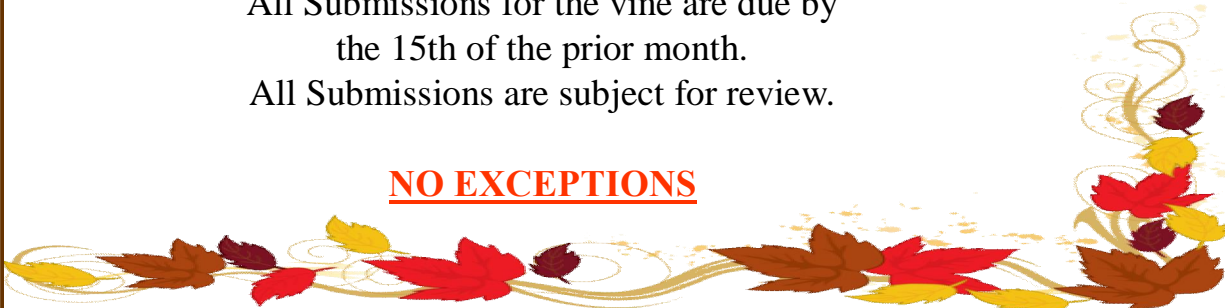

A Message From Rabbi Rubin



Rabbinic Reflections
By Rabbi Robert Rubin

What Happens in Israel Does NOT Stay in Israel

What happens in Israel impacts on Jews and non-Jews around the world. Decisions made by Israel's government affects the relationship between us as Jews and the Jewish State. There are many issues in the upcoming Israeli Election, and the outcome of the Election will help shape the picture of religious and cultural life in Israel for Jews and for all Israeli citizens.

Israel is having this special Election Day on September 17, 2019. This is after the Election on April 9 did not produce a majority coalition of parties in the Knesset (Israel's Parliament). Previous articles have described the Israeli Election Process which is different from our American system.

In brief: On Election Day in Israel, voters make one choice and choose the party that they feel best represents them. The parties then win a percentage of the 120 Knesset seats based on the percentage of the national vote that each party receives. For example, a party that receives 20% of the national vote wins 20% (24) of the 120 Knesset seats, and the first 24 individuals on its party list of candidates become Members of Knesset. The President of Israel then chooses one party leader to form a majority coalition of 61 seats or more. After the April 9 Election, Benjamin Netanyahu of the Likud party was chosen to form a majority coalition but was only able to form a coalition of 60 seats – not a majority. A new election was called.

You can use this chart on the next page to follow the upcoming Israeli Election. It is helpful to have a program to tell the players. Use the open column on the right side as a scorecard of Election Day AND beyond (in the subsequent phase of forming a majority coalition).

Israel is a robust democracy. Let us treasure that and follow closely what is happening there – for their sake and for ours.

Let us begin the upcoming Jewish New Year with a renewed hope for peace and coexistence in Israel, in America, in the entire world and right here in our community.

Let Israel show the way!

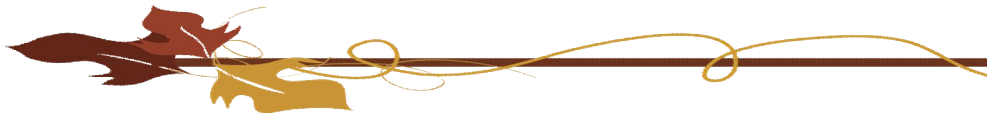

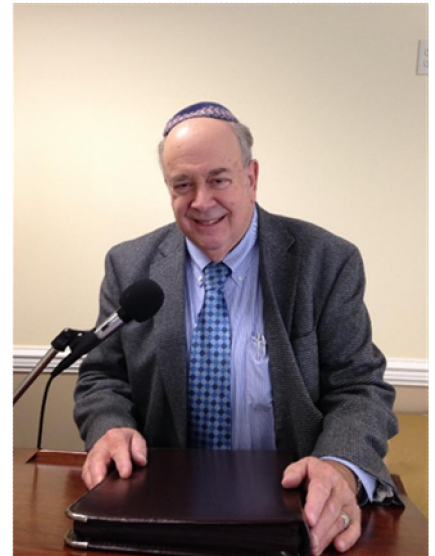

Aufruf Torah Aliyah

Non-members - **\$150.00**

If the event is held as part of the Saturday morning Shabbat service, it is expected that the Kiddush following the service will be sponsored in honor of the occasion.

Wedding - does not include a Chuppah.

The Rabbi does not have to be the officiant.

TBO Members - **\$200.00**

Non-members - **\$300.00**

Baby Naming Torah Aliyah

Funeral (use of Sanctuary)

The Rabbi does not have to be the officiant.

TBO Members - **No Charge**

For a Kaddish relative of a TBO Member (parent, spouse, sibling, child) - **No Charge**

For a Non-member - **\$550.00** (to be billed to the funeral director)

Following the funeral, if appropriate, a surviving relative is to be offered a one year courtesy membership or a \$550 credit to a higher priced membership with the welcome invitation to come here to attend services and to say Kaddish.

Kaddish Recitation

A TBO member or a Kaddish relative of a TBO member who dies is to be remembered and automatically placed on the 11-month Mourner's List which is read at the time of the recitation of the Mourner's Kaddish at the end of Shabbat services on Friday nights and Saturday mornings. There is no required donation for this. A request may be made to add a non-member to the Mourner's List and have them remembered and included at the time of the recitation of the Mourner's Kaddish at the end of Shabbat services on Friday nights and Saturday mornings.

A \$300 donation is requested for this.
