A MESSAGE FROM OUR RABBI

Elections! Elections!

Normally, we do not ask you to vote a certain way in an election. This time I am asking you to vote for a particular set of candidates.

NO, NOT in the American elections which is underway through the current series of state primaries. It would be inappropriate for a house of worship to advocate for one candidate over another, and it would risk losing are not-profit status.

NO, NOT in the Israeli elections coming up on March 2. Only citizens of Israel can vote in their national elections, and we would not endorse one party and slate of candidates over another.

There is a different election happening and I want you to VOTE IN IT. We have very few opportunities, as Jews living in America, to influence and make change in Israel. This is one of those times.

Every five years, Jews from around the world are asked to step-up and be counted in the World Zionist Congress Election. 152 delegates will be elected to represent the United States and then make critical decisions about the future of the Jewish people in Israel – religious freedom, democratic principles, and the celebration of diversity – are all at stake.

In 1897, Theodor Herzl convened the 1st World Zionist Congress in Basle, Switzerland. In 1948, Israel became an independent state. This year, in October, the United States delegates will join hundreds from Israel and around the world at the 38th World Zionist Congress. It has been called the international "parliament of the Jewish people" as it makes decisions to allocate nearly one billion dollars annually to support Israel and World Jewry (including the World Zionist Organization, Jewish National Fund and the Jewish Agency for Israel).

There are fifteen slates of candidates running in this election. The Conservative Movement has one slate called MERCAZ. Your vote for MERCAZ – Slate 6 will increase our share of the U.S. delegation and increase the amount of input we will have in allocating resources to support the Conservative/Masorti Movement in Israel. Your vote can make real change by supporting our programs and institutions in Israel which are inclusive and egalitarian, and which do not receive support from the Israeli government as do Orthodox programs and institutions.

It is easy to vote and open to all American Jews who are 18 years and older. Go to MERCAZ2020.org and follow the steps. There is a small processing fee to cover the costs of the election. Paper ballots are also available. Contact me. Voting is open until March 11, 2020.

Stand up and be counted. Cast your vote for the MERCAZ Slate – Slate 6. Every vote counts. Join us!


