# Israel Can Show Us the Way

Our government and our society are so polarized that people on one side do not want to even speak with someone on the other side of the political divide. This is happening in other democracies around the world, including Israel.

Israeli society is divided in many different ways. Politically, there are groups of the far right, the right, the center-right, the center, the center-left, the left and the far left. Religiously and ethnically, there are Jews and Arabs (and a few others) and there are Jews, Muslims, Christians and Druze (and a few others). Among just the Jews, there are the non-nationalistic charedi ultra-Orthodox, nationalistic modern Orthodox, Masorti Traditional, Religious Liberal and Secular. Some have described Israel's population as comprising of different "tribes."

Given this intense diversity, it is understandable why Israel recently had four government elections in about two years instead of one election every four years. The election results were so diffuse that a coalition of enough parties to form a majority coalition of 61 or more seats in the Knesset Parliament was not able to be formed three different times in a row. This fourth time turned out to be different.

On June 13, a proposed Coalition of eight parties passed the Knesset with a Vote of Confidence with 60 in favor, 59 against and 1 abstention, the slimmest possible margin. Naftali Bennett was sworn in as Prime Minister and Yair Lapid was sworn in as Alternate Prime Minister and Foreign Minister. Former Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu became the head of the Parliamentary Opposition.

Naftali Bennett (Yamina party) is to be Prime Minister for the first two years and then Yair Lapid (Yesh Atid party) is to be Prime Minister for two years. This would be the first time that the leader of a small party is Prime Minister rather than one of the leaders of the larger parties. Also, Bennett is considered nationalistic modern Orthodox, and this is the first time an Orthodox Jew is Prime Minister. This is also the first time an Israeli Arab party (Ra'am United Arab List) is part of the Government Coalition. There is also a major change in that the two Charedi/Ultra-Orthodox parties (Shas and United Torah Judaism) are not in the Government Coalition.

This Government Coalition represents a national unity government from many angles, including an alignment of the political right and center and left, of religious and secular and of Jewish and Arab all serving together in one government. Some Yamina members reflected on the tenor of the Coalition, basically saying that "every member knows that they probably cannot realize their full agendas, and they know that if they start attacking each other, the government won't survive. The partners are coming with a lot of goodwill."

Times of Israel reported: Bennett vowed that the government will work to "mend the rift in the nation" after two years of political deadlock. He urged his ministers to show "restraint" over the numerous ideological differences between the disparate parties in the coalition to ensure its stability. Yair Lapid, sitting alongside Bennett, said "friendship and trust" were the foundation of the government and only "friendship and trust" will keep it in power.

The diversity of this new Government Coalition was also reflected on by some U.S. lawmakers. Senator Jacky Rosen of Nevada stated: "The diversity of the new coalition, uniting left and right, Jews and Arabs, is a testament to the vibrancy of Israel's democracy." Representative Ted Deutch of Florida stated: "... the formation of a new coalition government, made up of a broad range of parties and representing many different views and communities ... is a testament to the resilience and vibrancy of Israel's democratic system."

Many Israelis, even some who did not vote for it, hope that this government coalition can survive long enough to form a stable government. Hopefully, Israel can be an "Or Lagoyim" – a light onto the nations – showing us how people with different views can still respect each other and work together for the greater good.

Tisha B'Av (9<sup>th</sup> of Av, this year on Saturday night-Sunday, July 17-18) is the saddest day of the Jewish calendar commemorating the destruction of Jerusalem and the Holy Temple – the First Temple by the Babylonians in 586 BCE and the Second Temple by the Romans in 70 CE. The ancient sages reflected on the destruction of the Second Temple by connecting it to the internal Jewish divisions in which people hated each other for no good reason (sinat chinam – baseless hatred).

May Israel, American society and all societies not fall victim to baseless hatred. May Israel show all of us the way to rebuild friendship, trust and mutual respect.

On the 9th Day of the Jewish month of Av, we recall the destruction of Jerusalem and the Holy Temple – the first time by the Babylonians in 586 BCE and the second time by the Romans in 70 CE. It is a fast day and we read the biblical Book of Eichah (Lamentations). While observing the sadness we also appreciate Jerusalem as the capital of Israel once again, and we strengthen our bonds with modern-day Jerusalem as we recall its history.

This year, the Ninth of Av occurs on Saturday night, July 17 and Sunday, July 18.

A time of sadness leads up to Tishah B'Av -


- The Three Weeks begin with the Fast of the 17th Day of Tammuz (this year on Sunday, June 27)



### **FUNERAL**

(use of Sanctuary) The Rabbi does not have to be the officiant. <u>TBO Members - No Charge</u> For a Kaddish relative of a TBO Member (parent, spouse, sibling, child) - <u>No Charge</u> For a Non-member - \$550.00 (to be billed to the funeral director)

Following the funeral, if appropriate, a surviving relative is to be offered a one year courtesy membership or a \$550 credit to a higher priced membership with the welcome invitation to come here to attend services and to say Kaddish.

### **KADDISH RECITATION**

A TBO member or a Kaddish relative of a TBO member who dies is to be remembered and automatically placed on the 11month Mourner's List which is read at the time of the recitation of the Mourner's Kaddish at the end of Shabbat services on Friday nights and Saturday mornings. There is no required donation for this.

A request may be made to add a non-member to the Mourner's List and have them remembered and included at the time of the recitation of the Mourner's Kaddish at the end of Shabbat services on Friday nights and Saturday mornings.

A \$300.00 donation is requested for this.
