## **A MESSAGE FROM OUR RABBI**

### **In a Congregation, we Congregate**

The three basic roles of a synagogue are often specified as Beit T'fillah (House of Prayer), Beit Midrash (House of Study) and Beit K'nesset (House of Assembly). At Temple Beth Or (House of Light), we do all three.

We hold prayer services on weekdays, Shabbat and Holidays, both in-person and online through Zoom. We study through learning sessions in classes, at services and with various special events.

In all of what we do, coming together – assembling, congregating – is critical! We are individuals who come together to help each other fulfill our obligations as Jews and as human beings in society. We are not alone – we have each other!

Recently, we have resumed our in-person Shabbat services (along with Zoom access). I sincerely hope to see you there.

I know that everyone may at times have possible conflicts and medical health needs that need to be taken into account. If you cannot attend in-person, then join us on Zoom. If you cannot attend in-person or on Zoom for the entire service, come for half of the service. Friday night services are generally 7:15-8:05 PM and Saturday morning services are generally 9:30-11:15 AM. Weekday services are about 30 minutes and the Saturday night service with Havdalah is about 20 minutes.

We are moving closer toward having a new permanent home for Temple Beth Or. For now, we continue to have in-person prayer services and events at St. Thomas Lutheran Church.

Fortunately, for now, we have financial resources to keep TBO going. However, if people do not attend our services and events, then TBO cannot succeed. If you have suggestions related to what we offer, then let me know so that we can discuss them.

Congregations (Jewish and Christian) are facing similar challenges. Let us rise up and meet ours.

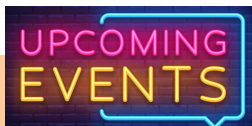

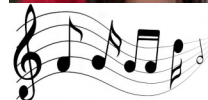
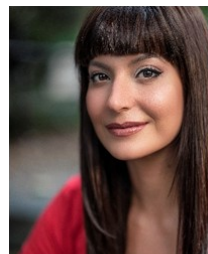

There are members, not named, who show their dedication by attending Shabbat, holiday, and weekday services, Sisterhood, Men's Club, and Temple meetings and events. By participating, virtually or in-person, we show our dedication to our Temple Beth Or and its future.

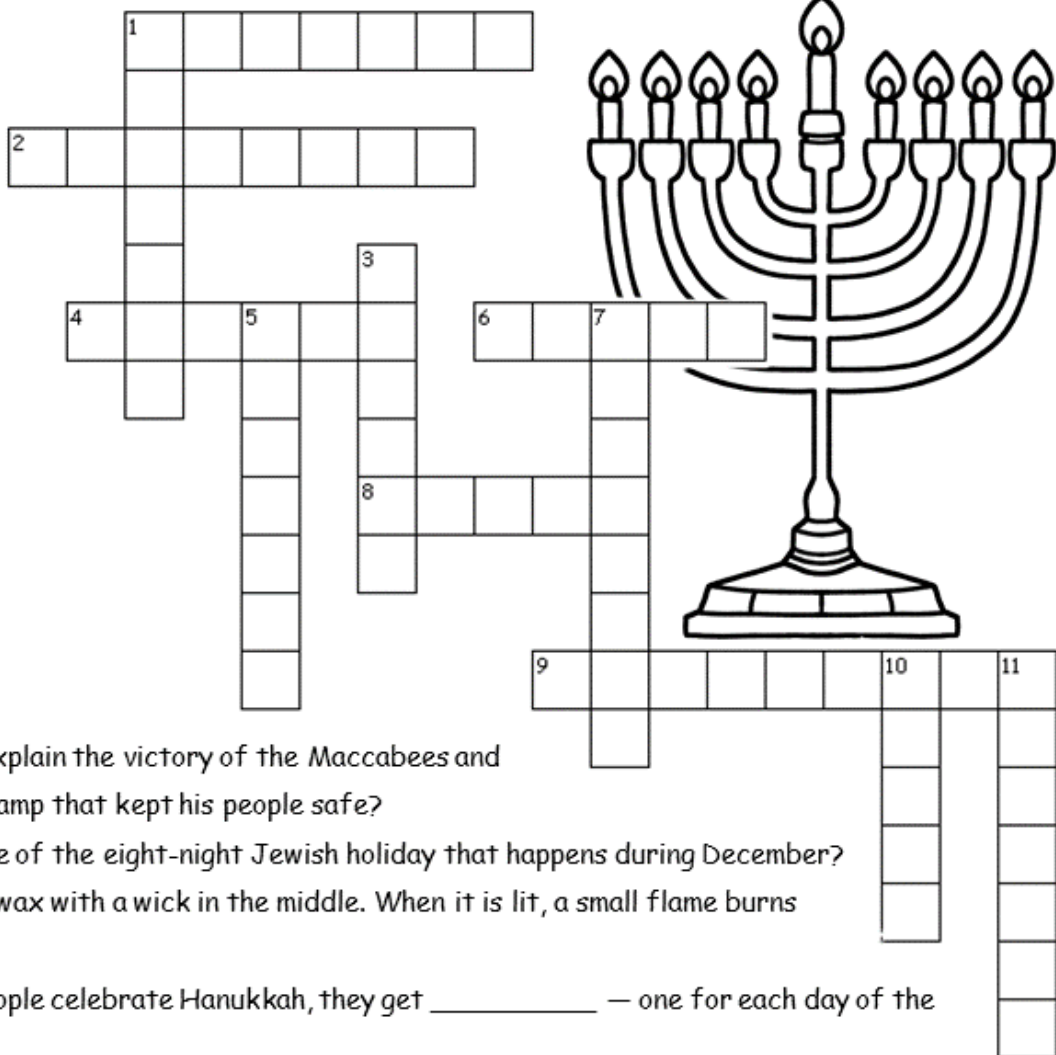

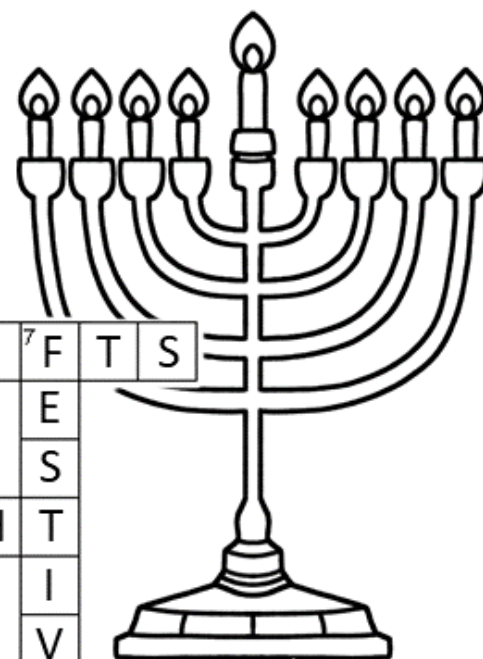
