A MESSAGE FROM OUR RABBI

From Survival to Freedom – for Us and for Ukraine

Last year, at about this time, I wrote about Purim as a holiday celebrating SURVIVAL and Pesach as a holiday celebrating FREEDOM.

In the Book of Esther (8:16), after the plot of Haman to destroy us was turned upside down, “layehudim hayitah orah v’simchah v’sason veekar” – the Jews had light and gladness and joy and honor. We include this verse in the Havdalah ceremony at the end of Shabbat as we begin the new week, and we add a phrase: “keyn tehiyeh lanu” – so it should be for us!

Haman was out to destroy us, to eradicate all of us. He failed, we survived, and we celebrate. A month after Purim comes Pesach, celebrating our liberation from Pharoah and Egyptian slavery.

Last year, in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic, I wrote: “Survival and Freedom – both important. Without surviving, we are not around to be free. Without freedom, our survival is a life of oppression. We need both and we need to appreciate both and not take either our survival or our freedom for granted.”

This year, the crisis in Ukraine is front and center. The war unleashed by President Putin and Russia has been devastating and was uncalled for. Thousands have been killed or injured and millions have been displaced as refugees. Ukraine needs and deserves SURVIVAL and FREEDOM.

We can help the Ukrainian people by donating to those organizations that are already on the ground in the region. Locally, you can donate to the Jewish Federation of Ocean County, 1235A Highway 70, Lakewood, NJ 08701 (indicate “Ukraine Relief” in the memo line) which is transferring the money to several established organizations who are doing the actual relief work.

As Ukraine fights for its survival and freedom, we celebrate our survival, our freedom and our opportunity to channel these precious gifts to the betterment of others.

Emergency Campaign to help the Jews of Ukraine during this crisis – You can contribute through the Jewish Federation of Ocean County to help the Joint Distribution Committee who are already on the ground working in Ukraine. There are possibly upwards of 300,000 Jews in Ukraine, 40,000 of whom are vulnerable and/or elderly. Our partners at the JDC provide services at more than 1000 locations throughout the country and they work with all partners, including Chabads and the International Fellowship of Christians and Jews. Many who are able have already made their way to the western part of the country, with several thousand crossing into Poland or Romania. Needs of these refugees has yet to be determined, and there will likely be thousands more as this conflict progresses. Estimates are that initial emergency services as a result of this crisis will cost upwards of \$14 Million for the next two months. The Jewish Federation of Ocean County is already sending funds, but the more we raise, the more we can help. Be Prepared – CERT is Community Emergency Response Team, a nationwide volunteer organization which most towns have. It backs up First Responders. Members are trained on what to do before, during and after a disaster, including basic first aid, CPR, fire safety, light search & rescue and triage. CERT members have assisted with evacuations, food & water distribution, fire and Super Storm Sandy as well as at township events, such as Summerfest, Night Against Crime and Trunk or Treat. When disaster strikes, those trained are able to assist the police and EMS, help themselves and help their neighbors. Successful completion of a CERT course, which includes a written & practical test and background check, are the requirements to become a CERT member. Preparedness is very important. Please stop in the Temple Beth Or office, located in St. Thomas Lutheran Church, Monday-Friday, 9:00 AM – 1:00 PM to pick up a Disaster Preparedness Guide. 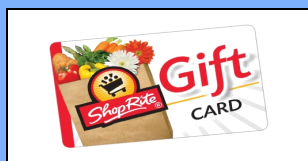

Selling of Chametz before Pesach

An important part of the preparation for Pesach is the removal of Chametz (leavened food forbidden on

Passover) before Passover begins in order to fulfill the commandment in the Torah, "no Chametz shall be

found in your homes." This authorization for the sale of the Chametz should be submitted by the end of Wednesday, April 13, 2022.

The tradition of selling the Chametz transfers ownership of all leaven from our homes to a non-Jewish person for the duration of the Pesach holiday. The Chametz should not be used until after the Pesach holiday has ended plus one hour (which this year would be on Saturday, April 23 at 9:28 PM).

The form below grants full power and authority to Rabbi Rubin to serve as your agent to sell your Chametz as shall be deemed fit and proper in full accordance with Halakhah (Jewish Law).

Voluntary donations of any amount made in conjunction with this document will be deposited in the Temple Beth Or Rabbi Discretionary Fund and used to help people in need of food assistance. These donations are called Me'ot Chitim (Money for Wheat).

Arthur Szyk and the Art of the Haggadah

Arthur Szyk (b. 1894, Lodz, Poland – d. 1951, New Canaan, CT, USA) worked in Poland, France, England, Canada, and the United States, and was renowned for his prolific illustrations in books, newspapers, and magazines, commenting on contemporary issues, including World War II, the Holocaust, and the creation of the State of Israel. Szyk has often been compared to Norman Rockwell for his artwork and illustrations.

Irvin Ungar, a former pulpit rabbi and antiquarian bookseller, has specialized in Arthur Szyk research. Ungar is the author of *Arthur Szyk: Soldier in Art* (winner of the 2017 National Jewish Book Award), co-producer of the documentary film, “Soldier in Art: Arthur Szyk,” and the creator and publisher of the luxury limited edition of *The Szyk Haggadah*. He has also served as the curator of The Arthur Szyk Society in Burlingame, California.

GREETINGS FROM THE MITZVAH GROUP

Dear Fellow Congregants,

Let's pretend it is Friday, April 15, 2022, corresponding to 14 Nisan 5782. It's almost Seder time.

Our guests have arrived safely. The appealing aromas of holiday foods for the festive meal are filling our homes. The symbolic foods and ritual objects are on our tables. Some of us may be using heirlooms entrusted to us by our dear ancestors to remember, appreciate, and perpetuate the holiday. In reality, much thought and effort preceded this scenario.

This message from The Mitzvah Group contains some tips you might like to consider trying for your pre-Pesach preparations. Some can give you a head start for next year.

With Rabbi Rubin: Arrange to sell your chametz early. Also your donations allow him to provide funds for the needy which enable them to buy their Passover foods. If you have questions about procedures, ask them early so you can follow the guidelines appropriately, as they fit your situation.

With young children: Provide them with red and green construction paper and their art supplies. They can draw designs and cut them in shapes to tape on to drawers and cabinets. Their green labels indicate the "go to" places for Passover. Their red labels indicate the "stop - don't use" places for Passover. 3M's blue painter's tape is easy to work with and leaves no residue or damage when removed. It is available at Home Depot. The children can also make place cards and be in charge of them before and after meals. They can be involved, helpful, and praised.

With your guests: Invite them early and learn if they have special dietary needs, especially if they are sleeping overnight for several days. You'll have time to search for recipes that are comparable to what you are serving the other guests and time to shop for the needed foods. If guests ask, "What can I bring?", give them several choices in different price ranges. Suggest items from what you would be buying anyway; for example, specific wines or pastries or pre-made salads. If they ask, "How can I help?", give them a pre-written list to read and commit to so you don't have to repeat the list for each guest who volunteers. You may need several people to serve the meal, clear the table, do the dishes, but you need only one person to take the children for a walk or read them a story as a break. If the job is off your to-do list, you can focus on something else.

GREETINGS FROM THE MITZVAH GROUP CONTINUED

With your hosting team: Prepare a chart indicating when specific tasks need to be done and who is responsible for doing them. For example, one month ahead - invite guests - dad. Three weeks ahead - finalize shopping lists - mom. Two weeks ahead - vacuum car - older children, etc. There will be several tasks in each time category, depending on your family's situation and customs.

C P O = Chief Passover Organizer: This is the person who plans and oversees the entire process. The CPO needs to keep checking that everything and everyone is ready on time, with happy anticipation, for celebrating Pesach together.

While Pesach 5782-2022 is fresh in your mind, mark the recipes you prepared with, like or dislike so you will know what to repeat or avoid. Make a list of what items need to be replaced, such as a broken measuring cup. Keep a list of non-perishable items that you use each Passover so you can buy them when they are on sale during the year, such as dishwashing supplies, plastic bags, foil wrap, disposable baking pans, and storage containers, especially if you give your guests food to take home.
