

Election Day, Veterans Day and Thanksgiving – Are They Connected?

I think Yes, even if it does not seem so at first.

Election Day (November 8) gives us the opportunity to participate in our American process of self-government. Sometimes called the "American experiment," we want to keep this experiment of democracy going and going strong. It is crucial that we vote and encourage others to vote and not give up on our system. Voting is like an American "mitzvah" that we should make sure that we do.

Veterans Day (November 11) honors those who served (and also those who are now serving) in the military protecting our liberty and our democracy. Their service gives us the opportunity to vote and live our lives in freedom. It should be added that Memorial Day (in May) honors those who served and made the ultimate sacrifice and died to protect us and our way of life. This year on Veterans Day, we are hosting members of the Jewish War Veterans Ocean-Monmouth Post #178 at our Friday night Shabbat Service. Come and join us.

Thanksgiving Day (November 24) focuses our attention our things we often take for granted – food, family, community, democracy and more. We are reminded to pause and express thanks for those things of which we are blessed – thanks to God and thanks to each other.

We should vote and participate in community affairs. We should remember and honor those who help make that possible. We should give thanks for the opportunity to do all that.

I also want to thank our members for joining again this year. We rely on your dues to provide enjoyable monthly programs, whether in person or on Zoom.



Members are trained on what to do before, during and after a disaster, including basic first aid, CPR, fire safety, light search & rescue and triage. CERT members have assisted with evacuations, food & water distribution, fire and Super Storm Sandy as well as at township events, such

as Summerfest, Night Against Crime and Trunk or Treat. When disaster strikes, those trained are able to assist the police and EMS, help themselves and help their neighbors. Successful completion of a CERT course, which includes a written & practical test and background check, are the requirements to become a CERT member. Preparedness is very important. Please stop in the Temple Beth Or office, located in St. Thomas Lutheran Church, Monday-Friday, 9:00 AM - 1:00 PM to pick up a Disaster Preparedness Guide. 

Following the funeral, if appropriate, a surviving relative is to be offered a one year courtesy membership or a \$550 credit to a higher priced membership with the welcome invitation to come here to attend services and to say Kaddish.

KADDISH RECITATION

A TBO member or a Kaddish relative of a TBO member who dies is to be remembered and automatically placed on the 11month Mourner's List which is read at the time of the recitation of the Mourner's Kaddish at the end of Shabbat services on Friday nights and Saturday mornings. There is no required donation for this.
