A MESSAGE FROM OUR RABBI

Israel – We Are Concerned!



Israel is now facing a major political crisis. It is not about candidates in an election. It is not about the ongoing Israeli-Arab situation. It is not about the economy.

It is about the future of democracy in Israel. It is about whether Israel can remain both a Jewish AND a democratic state. It is about whether the Israeli government will continue to function with regular checks and balances between the Supreme Court/judiciary and the Knesset/Parliament/legislature (and the governing Coalition/Executive that comes out of the Knesset).

In the United States, we have three co-equal branches of government with checks and balances between them so that no one branch can rule alone over the others. In Israel, they have basically two branches of government.

Currently, the Knesset can pass a law and the Supreme Court can overturn it. One of the proposals being pushed by the current governing Coalition (with 64 seats out of the 120 in the Knesset) is that the Knesset will have the power to pass laws that would be immune from Supreme Court review. Another proposal is that if the Supreme Court did overturn a law passed by the Knesset, the Knesset could override the Supreme Court by a simple majority of 61.

The results of these proposals would give the Knesset the power to vote whatever it wants without any of the checks and balances that help maintain a democracy. Many people fear the tyranny of the majority which could ignore the rights of the minority (and Israel has many minorities). The governing Coalition claims that the Supreme Court needs to be "reined in" from being too interventionist and too activist. The protestors dispute that claim.

This is such a big issue that Israelis have been protesting in mass gatherings (often on Saturday night after Shabbat) for about twelve straight weeks. More protests are planned. At times, 500,000 Israelis have shown up for protests held all over Israel. In American terms, that would be like 15,000,000 people protesting all at the same time. Israeli President Isaac Herzog has delivered several "addresses to the nation" just in the last few weeks, which is similar to the U.S. President speaking from the Oval Office. President Herzog has warned of "blood in the streets" and the potential for civil war. He has called on the governing Coalition and the Opposition to sit down together and follow a more compromising framework.

As the Romans were besieging Jerusalem in 70 CE, the sages later lamented that while the siege was happening, the Jews in Jerusalem were fighting each other and that there was baseless hatred (sinat chinam) one for another within our community.

We can have differences of opinion. However, we must find ways to work together. We pray for the peace in Israel. We must stay informed about the events in Israel. There are many good English language sources for news and opinion; to mention two – online there is The Times of Israel and on TV and online there is i24 News.

At the end of the Pesach Seder, we say: Next Year in Jerusalem! At the end of the Pesach Seders this year, let us say: This year Peace in Jerusalem, in Israel and in the world!

Chag Pesach Sameach – May you (and Israel) have a happy (and peaceful) Pesach holiday!

Be Prepared – CERT is Community Emergency Response Team, a nationwide volunteer organization which most towns have. It backs up First Responders. Members are trained on what to do before, during and after a disaster, including basic first aid, CPR, fire safety, light search & rescue and triage. CERT members have assisted with evacuations, food & water distribution, fire and Super Storm Sandy as well as at township events, such as Summerfest, Night Against Crime and Trunk or

Treat. When disaster strikes, those trained are able to assist the police and EMS, help themselves and help their neighbors. Successful completion of a CERT course, which includes a written & practical test and background check, are the requirements to become a CERT member. Preparedness is very important. Selling of Chametz before Pesach

An important part of the preparation for Pesach is the removal of Chametz (leavened food forbidden on Passover) before Passover begins in order to fulfill the commandment in the Torah, "no Chametz shall be found in your homes." This authorization for the sale of the Chametz should submitted by the end of Monday, April 3, 2023.

The tradition of selling the Chametz transfers ownership of all leaven from our homes to a non-Jewish person for the duration of the Pesach holiday. The Chametz should not be used until after the Pesach holiday has ended plus one hour (which this year would be on Thursday, April 13 at 9:17 PM).

The form below grants full power and authority to Rabbi Rubin to serve as your agent to sell your Chametz as shall be deemed fit and proper in full accordance with Halakhah (Jewish Law).

Voluntary donations of any amount made in conjunction with this document will be deposited in the Temple Beth Or Rabbi Discretionary Fund and used to help people in need of food assistance. These donations are called Me'ot Chitim (Money for Wheat).
