A MESSAGE FROM OUR RABBI

Being Full of Joy

Be happy! It sounds simple. However, it is not always so simple.

We want to be happy, however things can get in the way. Life has its ups and downs – we appreciate the ups and struggle with the downs. Sometimes it is going well and sometimes not so much.

It is natural and normal to be happy with the ups in life and sad and mournful with the downs. We are challenged to appreciate and celebrate the ups and to summon our inner strength and the help of others to cope with and get through the downs.

Judaism teaches us to have hope – tikvah. Hatikvah (The Hope) is Israel's national anthem coming out of the early Zionist Movement. Certainly, with everything the Jewish people and Israel, in particular, have gone through, the song highlights the hope for our free and safe existence as a Jewish people.

Our rabbinic sages taught us – mishenichnas adar, marbin b'simchah – from when the Jewish month of Adar begins, we increase our joy.

Do we increase our joy naturally from the effect of the holiday of Purim that is getting closer OR are we guided and told to increase our joy, even if we do not feel it, because Purim is coming?

If we are already happy, then it is not difficult to get happier in Adar and on Purim. However, if we are not happy very much, then we are challenged to face the issues, take a step back, try to see the bigger picture and strive to be happy with what we have and thus increase our joy during this time.

Purim celebrates many things, including the survival of the Jewish people against those who sought and still seek our demise and destruction. Despite the threats against us, we are here. Let us celebrate our very existence as part of the extended family of the Jewish people and our existence as individuals.

In short: Be happy, it's Adar!

Be Prepared – CERT is Community Emergency Response Team, a nationwide volunteer organization which most towns have. It backs up First Responders. Members are trained on what to do before, during and after a disaster, including basic first aid, CPR, fire safety, light search & rescue and triage. CERT members have assisted with evacuations, food & water distribution, fire and Super Storm Sandy as well as at township events, such as Summerfest, Night Against Crime and Trunk or Treat. When disaster strikes, those trained are able to assist the police and EMS, help themselves and help their neighbors. Successful completion of a CERT course, which includes a written & practical test and background check, are the requirements to become a CERT member. Preparedness is very important. Please stop in the Temple Beth Or office, located in St. Thomas Lutheran Church, Monday-Friday, 9:00 AM – 1:00 PM to pick up a Disaster Preparedness Guide. 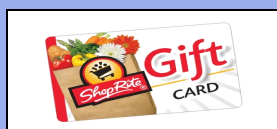

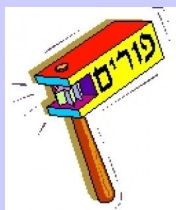

Selling of Chametz before Pesach

An important part of the preparation for Pesach is the removal of Chametz (leavened food forbidden on Passover) before Passover begins in order to fulfill the commandment in the Torah, “no Chametz shall be found in your homes.” This authorization for the sale of the Chametz should be submitted by the end of Monday, April 3, 2023.

The tradition of selling the Chametz transfers ownership of all leaven from our homes to a non-Jewish person for the duration of the Pesach holiday. The Chametz should not be used until after the Pesach holiday has ended plus one hour (which this year would be on Thursday, April 13 at 9:17 PM).

The form below grants full power and authority to Rabbi Rubin to serve as your agent to sell your Chametz as shall be deemed fit and proper in full accordance with Halakhah (Jewish Law).

Voluntary donations of any amount made in conjunction with this document will be deposited in the Temple Beth Or Rabbi Discretionary Fund and used to help people in need of food assistance. These donations are called Me’ot Chitim (Money for Wheat).

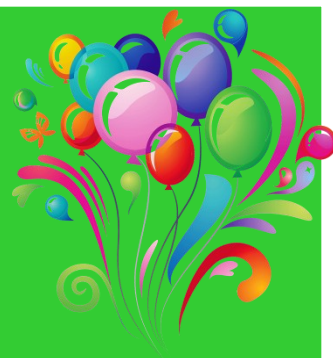

KADDISH RECITATION

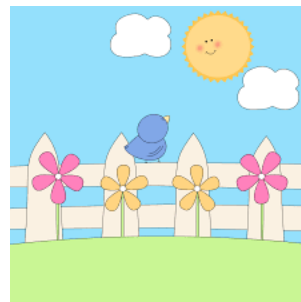
