

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Happy Summer!

Summertime usually means vacation time but...... there's no time off for us as we continue to work on our new building. The air conditioners have been replaced, bushes trimmed and new flooring has been put down in some of the rooms.

We are looking forward to our 1st Hebrew School Alumni Reunion on August 6th! If you, or someone you know, is a graduate of our Hebrew School please check your email for a flyer and RSVP. We'd love to see you! This month we have the Fast of the 17th of Tammuz, which is the start of a three-week mourning period culminating in the Fast of the 9th of Av, all in memory of the destruction of Jerusalem and the two Holy Temples.

The fast commemorates five tragic events that occurred on this date:

- 1. Moses broke the tablets when he saw the Jewish people worshipping the Golden Calf.
- 2. During the Babylonian siege of Jerusalem, the Jews were forced to cease offering the daily sacrifices due to the lack of sheep.
- 3. Apostomos burned the holy Torah.
- 4. An idol was placed in the Holy Temple.
- 5. The walls of Jerusalem were breached by the Romans after a lengthy siege and three weeks later, the Romans destroyed the second Holy Temple.

During this time, healthy adults abstain from eating or drinking between dawn and nightfall. It is permitted to wake up early before the fast begins in order to eat IF you had intended to do so before you went to sleep. As you know, a fast day is one in which G-d is accessible and waiting for us to repent. There are morning and afternoon prayers, during which the Torah is read, which discusses the Golden Calf incident and how Moses interceded on behalf of the Israelites and attained forgiveness for their sin.

As we recall the loss of our ancient Temples, let us build up our temple, Temple Beth Or.

We continue to have in-person services on Friday nights and Saturday mornings, and we look forward to you all joining us.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR RABBI

Jerusalem, You Are Always on Our Mind



This year, the month of July encompasses the saddest Three Weeks of the Jewish year – the Fast of the 17th of Tammuz through the Fast of the 9th of Av (this year July 6-27). These weeks help us remember and commemorate the destruction of the First Beit Hamikdash (Holy Temple) in Jerusalem by the Babylonians in 586 BCE and the destruction of the Second Beit Hamikdash (Holy Temple) in Jerusalem by the Romans in 70 CE.

These events were catastrophic to the Jewish people and we still recall them many centuries later. Yet, in each case, we, the Jewish people, recovered from our losses and moved forward with a renewed Judaism.

The special holy city of Jerusalem was the epicenter and focus of these tragic events. However, we think about Jerusalem all year long and not only during these Three Weeks.

Jerusalem today is a thriving city and, of course, is the capital city of the modern State of Israel (which is not the same as the Third Temple, but it is sometimes called the Third Commonwealth). There is so much history rooted, discovered and found in Jerusalem that you can feel it when you are there. There are so many songs, poems, prayers and writings about Jerusalem, both ancient and modern, that you can sing and read them all day long. Jerusalem is part of our prayers every day.

Our ancient rabbinic sages taught that ten measures of beauty came to the world. Nine went to Jerusalem and one to the rest of the world. Ten measures of bravery came to the world. Nine went to Jerusalem and one to the rest of the world. However, they also admitted that ten measures of anguish/suffering (tzoris) came to the world. Nine went to Jerusalem and one to the rest of the world!

The Psalmist (Psalm 137:5-6) declares: "If I forget you, O Jerusalem, let my right hand wither. Let my tongue stick to the roof my mouth if I do not remember you, if I do not set Jerusalem above my highest joy."

In the Book of Isaiah (62:1), the prophet declares: "For the sake of Zion I will not be silent, for the sake of Jerusalem I will not be still, until her righteousness goes forth like radiance and her salvation like a burning torch."

Like the Psalmist (122:6-7), we should "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem, may those who love you be at peace. May there be peace within your walls, peace in your palaces." Amen.

Be Prepared – CERT is Community Emergency Response Team, a nationwide volunteer organization which most towns have. It backs up First Responders. Members are trained on what to do before, during and after a disaster, including basic first aid, CPR, fire safety, light search & rescue and triage. CERT members have assisted with evacuations, food & water distribution, fire and Super Storm Sandy as well as at township events, such as Summerfest, Night Against Crime and Trunk or Treat. When dis-

aster strikes, those trained are able to assist the police and EMS, help themselves and help their neighbors. Successful completion of a CERT course, which includes a written & practical test and background check, are the requirements to become a CERT member. Preparedness is very important. Please stop in the Temple Beth Or office, located in St. Thomas Lutheran Church, Monday-Friday, 9:00 AM – 1:00 PM to pick up a Disaster Preparedness Guide. Tishah B'Av and Jerusalem: A Time to Remember, A City to Honor

On the 9th Day of the Jewish month of Av, we recall the destruction of Jerusalem and the Holy Temple – the first time by the Babylonians in 586 BCE and the second time by the Romans in 70 CE. It is a fast day and we read the biblical Book of Eichah (Lamentations). While observing the sadness we also appreciate Jerusalem as the capital of Israel once again, and we strengthen our bonds with modern-day Jerusalem as we recall its history.

This year, the Ninth of Av occurs on Wednesday night-Thursday, July 26-27, 2023.

Join us for the Tishah B'Av service with the reading of the Book of Eichah/Lamentations on Wednesday night, July 26 at 7:45 PM.

Minchah and Maariv minyan services – 7:45-8:15 PM Reading of the Book of Eichah – 8:15-9:00 PM

The service will be online through Zoom with the Book of Eichah shown on the screen as we read it.

Thursday, July 27 Minyan (Minchah for the Fast Day and Maariv) -6:30-7:30 PM

On July 27 – Note that on Tishah B'Av morning, the Shacharit Service is prayed *without* tallit and tefillin and on Tishah B'Av afternoon, the Minchah Service is prayed *with* tallit and tefillin.

A time of sadness leads up to Tishah B'Av -

The Three Weeks – begin with the Fast of the 17th Day of Tammuz (this year – Thursday, July 6)

The Nine Days -

begin with the Rosh Chodesh (New Moon) of Av (this year on Tuesday night-Wednesday, July 18-19) During these nine days, it is customary to not have meat or wine except on Shabbat.

A time of comfort and rebuilding follows Tishah B'Av –

The Seven Weeks – from Tishah B'Av to Rosh Hashanah (New Year) (this year beginning on Friday night, September 15, 2023)
