## A MESSAGE FROM OUR RABBI

## Selichah! Pardon Me!

In Hebrew, if you accidentally bump into someone, you say "Selichah" meaning "pardon me" or "excuse me." It is a way of asking forgiveness.

Asking forgiveness is an all-year round obligation. Prayers for forgiveness are built into the daily prayer liturgy. However, at this time of the year, the importance of forgiveness is emphasized.

The Jewish month of Elul serves as a preparation for the coming High Holidays. We reflect more intensely on the process of cheshbon hanefesh (taking an account of the soul). The special prayer service entitled "Selichot" (this year on Saturday night, September 9 – see pages 7 and 13 for details) includes an anthology of prayers focusing on forgiveness. This year we are planning a special Selichot-in-theround evening service, and I hope that you can attend.

Before the High Holidays can help atone for us, we need to be proactive and apologize to anyone we may have hurt and ask for their forgiveness. If there is anyone that I have slighted, spoken ill of or otherwise hurt, I apologize and hope you will forgive me. In this way, Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur can help us move forward with renewed and strengthened relationships with each other and with God.

Let us work together to rebuild anything that is broken within ourselves and within our community. Let us begin by saying "Selichah" – pardon me – and by pardoning others who ask for our forgiveness.

May we all have a good new year – Shanah Tovah – as we celebrate the many holidays and special days that are coming. Join us in-person and on Zoom as we navigate the holiday schedule of services. May we take the lessons of these special days with us throughout the coming year!

## Selichot in the Round – Something New for The New Year

This time of year, during the month of Elul, is a time *for heshbon hanefesh* – taking stock of our souls, a time for self-introspection and evaluation. It is a time to reflect on our lives during this past year and to ponder what we could have done better and what encounter or encounters – ongoing or fleeting – touched our hearts or transformed our lives.

What small decision ended up shaping the outcome of a day in your life or that changed the very direction or nature of your life? In what way did a small gesture, a brief interaction or an insignificant conversation awaken you, comfort you, inspire you, change you?

We are asking you, our congregants, to submit a very brief story, poem or reflection that answers those questions. From the submissions we receive, the Rabbis and Cantors of the four participating congregations will select some of them to be read during the Community Selichot Service this year which will take place Saturday, September 9 at 8:30 PM at Beth Am Shalom, 1235 Highway 70, Lakewood.

Submissions should be no more than 200 words and be submitted by email to me at RBobRubin@gmail.com. Please place your submission directly in your email, not as an attachment, and send it absolutely no later than Labor Day, September 4. Please note that all submissions will be printed and distributed during the service even if they are not read aloud.

This year's Selichot service in-the-round will be a new spiritual model for our community. Its success depends on your presence and the intimacy that we will create by sitting together in a circle. Therefore, there will not a Zoom or livestream connection for this service. We hope to see you on September 9.



Be Prepared – CERT is Community Emergency Response Team, a nationwide volunteer organization which most towns have. It backs up First Responders. Members are trained on what to do before, during and after a disaster, including basic first aid, CPR, fire safety, light search & rescue and triage. CERT members have assisted with evacuations, food & water distribution, fire and Super Storm Sandy as well as at township events, such as Summerfest, Night Against Crime and Trunk or Treat. When disaster strikes, those trained are able to assist the police and EMS, help themselves and help their neighbors. Successful completion of a CERT course, which includes a written & practical test and background check, are the requirements to become a CERT member. Preparedness is very important.
