A MESSAGE FROM OUR RABBI

An Extra Day, an Extra Month

In the month of February this year we are the recipients of several extras.

February in 2024, a year divisible by 4, is a leap year in the American secular solar-based calendar. Therefore, there is an extra day added – February 29 – to make a leap year of 366 days instead of the "regular" 365 days. In my high school sophomore year, I remember one student whose birthday was on February 29. We sometimes kidded him – was he only four years old instead of sixteen since his birth date had only come up four times? Of course, we knew that he was sixteen, but we were fascinated by the question. A related question to him (and I don't remember his answer) was – in the non-leap years did he celebrate his birthday on February 28 or March 1?

This year, during February, we have the beginning of an extra month in the Jewish lunar-solar-based calendar – Adar I – to make a leap year of 13 months instead of the "regular" 12 months. In a regular year, there is one month of Adar which is the month before the month of Nisan which is the month that includes the holiday of Pesach on the 15th day of Nisan. In a regular year, when Adar begins, Pesach is about six weeks away. In a leap year, like this one, when Adar I begins, it is followed by the month of Adar II, and thus Pesach is about 10 weeks away instead of 6. In this way, Pesach is pushed back later into the spring season so that it does not keep getting earlier each year to the point of moving into the winter season (which it would do if we did not have the leap month added 7 times in a 19-year cycle – Years 3, 6, 8, 11, 14, 17 and 19).

What will we do with the extra day and the extra month?

My wife Susan's father, Oscar Brown, had an elementary school teacher who had the following teaching on the blackboard throughout the year: "This is the dawning of a bright new day. Think! Will I let it pass uselessly away?" He thought about this message throughout his subsequent life. Let us do the same!

Let us fill the extra day and the extra month with deeds of kindness (Gemilut Chasadim), learning (Talmud Torah), giving of charity (Tzedakah), prayer (Tefillah), acts of repentance (Teshuvah), making our community and the world a better place (Tikkun Olam) and so many other good things. Let us fill every day and every month as we fill the extra ones.

Happy Leap Day and Happy Leap Month!



Be Prepared – **CERT is Community Emergency Response Team,** a nationwide volunteer organization which most towns have. It backs up First Responders. Members are trained on what to do before, during and after a disaster, including basic first aid, CPR, fire safety, light search & rescue and triage. CERT members have assisted with evacuations, food & water distribution, fire and Super Storm Sandy as well as at township events, such as Summerfest, Night Against Crime and Trunk or Treat. When disas-

ter strikes, those trained are able to assist the police and EMS, help themselves and help their neighbors. Successful completion of a CERT course, which includes a written & practical test and background check, are the requirements to become a CERT member. Preparedness is very important. Please stop in the Temple Beth Or office, located in St. Thomas Lutheran Church, Monday-Friday, 9:00 AM – 1:00 PM to pick up a Disaster Preparedness Guide.
