




# Let My People Go!

On Pesach we focus on our struggle to gain freedom from slavery in ancient Egypt. It was not an easy process. The telling of the Pesach story – at the Seder through the Haggadah or every Shabbat and every day through prayers – teaches us about this important story over and over again. Freedom is crucial. Freedom is precious. Freedom takes perseverance.

This year, we turn our attention to the over 130 Israeli hostages still being held in captivity by the Hamas and Palestinian Islamic Jihad terrorists. They were captured on October 7 and have been "enslaved" for over 170 days since then, with their suffering growing every day. We call on Hamas, as we called on ancient Pharoah, to "Let My People Go"!

Pharoah, in his day, was stubborn and did not let us go out of slavery until he and the Egyptians were pressured through the various plagues. At one point, even Pharoah's advisors began to tell Pharoah to let us go. Pharoah's stubbornness brought much suffering and destruction on Egypt and on Egyptian civilians.

Hamas has refused to release the Israeli hostages since the one deal that was reached in November in which many of the original 250 October 7th hostages were released. However, over 130 remain in captivity, presumably about 100 of whom are still alive. From the stubbornness of Hamas to not release the hostages has come much destruction all around Gaza and the suffering of the Gazan civilians. I do not know if there are Hamas "advisors' telling the Hamas leaders to "Let the Israelis go." Perhaps in the future we will find out.

This Pesach, let us continue to call out for "Let My People Go" – both as we celebrate our ancient liberation and as we pray and work for our modern liberation.

Susan and I wish for everyone to have a happy and meaningful Pesach Holiday – Chag Pesach Sameach!

# Selling of Chametz before Pesach

An important part of the preparation for Pesach is the removal of Chametz (leavened food forbidden on Passover) before Passover begins in order to fulfill the commandment in the Torah, "no Chametz shall be found in your homes." This authorization for the sale of the Chametz should submitted by the end of Thursday, April 18, 2024.

The tradition of selling the Chametz transfers ownership of all leaven from our homes to a non-Jewish person for the duration of the Pesach holiday. The Chametz should not be used until after the Pesach holiday has ended plus one hour (which this year would be on Tuesday, April 30 at 9:35 PM).

The form below grants full power and authority to Rabbi Rubin to serve as your agent to sell your Chametz as shall be deemed fit and proper in full accordance with Halakhah (Jewish Law).

Voluntary donations of any amount made in conjunction with this document will be deposited in the Temple Beth Or Rabbi Discretionary Fund and used to help people in need of food assistance. These donations are called Me'ot Chitim (Money for Wheat).

Be Prepared – CERT is Community Emergency Response Team, a nationwide volunteer organization which most towns have. It backs up First Responders. Members are trained on what to do before, during and after a disaster, including basic first aid, CPR, fire safety, light search & rescue and triage. CERT members have assisted with evacuations, food & water distribution, fire and Super Storm Sandy as well as at town-

ship events, such as Summerfest, Night Against Crime and Trunk or Treat. When disaster strikes, those trained are able to assist the police and EMS, help themselves and help their neighbors. Successful completion of a CERT course, which includes a written & practical test and background check, are the requirements to become a CERT member. Preparedness is very important. Please stop in the Temple Beth Or office, located in St. Thomas Lutheran Church, Monday-Friday, 9:00 AM - 1:00 PM to pick up a Disaster Preparedness Guide. 


