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

# A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

The month of March brings with it, the holiday of Purim, which celebrates the deliverance of the Jewish people from the wicked Haman in the days of Queen Esther of Persia. Purim is celebrated every year on the 14th of the Hebrew month of Adar (this year, being a Jewish Leap Year, 14 Adar II). This year, Purim begins Saturday night, March 23rd and continues through Sunday, March 24th.

The most well known Purim observance is the reading of the Megillah, which recounts the story of the Purim miracle and this is done on Purim eve and again the following day. Other observances include the giving money to at least two poor people, sending gifts of at least two kinds of food to at least one person and of course, no holiday would be complete without a festive feast, which includes wine.

When it comes to Purim traditions and customs, there is a spirit of liveliness and fun on Purim that is unparalleled on the Jewish calendar. If there were ever a day to "let loose" and just be Jewish, this is it! It is also customary for children (and adults, if they'd like) to dress up in costumes. As you probably know, a traditional Purim food is hamantaschen, which is a three-cornered pastry containing poppy seeds or sweet fillings. On the day before Purim (or on the Thursday before, when Purim is on Sunday), it is customary to fast, commemorating Esther's fasting and praying to <u>G-d</u> that He save His people.

## **Building Update:**

# Celebrating in Difficult Times

On Saturday night-Sunday, March 23-24 comes the holiday of Purim (see page 15). In these difficult times for Israel and for the world, many have asked whether we can celebrate the same way as in past years.

As of this writing, over 100 Israeli hostages remain in captivity by Hamas in Gaza. The war with Hamas continues, in order to rescue the hostages and to destroy the potential of more attacks coming from Gaza into Israel. The war of Russia against Ukraine, in which many originally had thought that Ukraine would lose in a few days, has entered its third year.

Purim celebrates the survival of the Jewish people in the ancient Persian Empire after being threatened with total annihilation. Today, Israelis have been attacked – murdered, injured and kidnapped – by Hamas who has threatened to continue its attempts to destroy all of us. Iran (modern-day Persia) continues to threaten to destroy Israel (and the United States, too). In this current situation, many have asked: How can we be happy and celebrate on Purim?

In the Megillah/Book of Esther, Chapter 9, it tells a part of the story, which is difficult to relate to, in which the Jews attacked Persians killing about 75,000 in total. Many have asked: Should we be celebrating that? Former Iranian President Ahmadinejad even once claimed this part of the Esther story as the reason Iran should attack Israel as a modern-day revenge.

However, it is important to look at the entire story and not just Chapter 9. When we do that, we see that the story for the Jews is one of self-defense.

Remember, Haman wanted to kill all of the Jews in the empire (3:9) and was willing to pay for it. An edict went out to the entire empire (3:13) to "destroy, massacre and exterminate all the Jews, young and old, children and women, on a single day (13 Adar) and to plunder their possessions." Later, after Esther intercedes with the King and finally identifies Haman as the culprit behind the edict, she asks (8:5) that another edict be issued to countermand the original edict. When it was stated that it was not possible to do that, a second edict was then issued that (8:11-12) "the King has permitted the Jews of every city to assemble and fight for their lives; if any people or province attacks them, they may destroy, massacre and exterminate its armed force together with women and children, and to plunder their possessions on a single day (13 Adar) in all of the provinces."

Basically, the King was allowing the Jews to defend themselves (meaning that we would not have been allowed to defend ourselves without permission!). If no one had attacked the Jews, there would not have been any reason for Jews to counterattack. As the new edict arrived in the various parts of the empire (8:17), "there was gladness and joy among the Jews, a feast and a holiday, and many people of the land professed to be Jews." Were the Persians actually converting to become Jewish? Interesting question.

However, some Persians did not like the new open attitude and proceeded to attack the Jews on 13 Adar as in the first edict of Haman. When that fateful day came, the Jews (9:16) "mustered and fought for their lives, they disposed of their enemies, killing 75,000 of their foes (note: across 127 provinces in a large empire), but they did not lay hands on the spoil." In the capital Shushan, the battle went on for two days and also (9:15) "they did not lay hands on the spoil" also specifying that they attacked men, presumably not women and children even though the King had allowed them to do so.

The story of Purim is one of being saved from destruction in the nick of time. It is also a story of self-defense. Battles and wars are tragic. Golda Meir has been quoted to have said about the Arab-Israeli conflict that "we can forgive you (the Arabs) for shooting at us, but we cannot forgive you for making us shoot at you."

Let us continue to pray for the Israeli hostages held by Hamas in Gaza to be released safely and soon, and that Israel will be able to defend itself when necessary. Let us pray for peace (shalom), for war not to be needed at all. We can celebrate Purim with all this in mind – joyfully and humbly. Let us pray, as it states in the Megillah (8:16) and as quoted and repeated as part of Havdalah at the end of Shabbat, that "the Jews enjoyed light and gladness, happiness and honor," that we can also.

Have a Happy Purim - Chag Purim Sameach!

Be Prepared – CERT is Community Emergency Response Team, a nationwide volunteer organization which most towns have. It backs up First Responders. Members are trained on what to do before, during and after a disaster, including basic first aid, CPR, fire safety, light search & rescue and triage. CERT members have assisted with evacuations, food & water distribution, fire and Super Storm Sandy as well as at township events, such as Summerfest, Night Against Crime and Trunk or Treat. When disas-

ter strikes, those trained are able to assist the police and EMS, help themselves and help their neighbors. Successful completion of a CERT course, which includes a written & practical test and background check, are the requirements to become a CERT member. Preparedness is very important.
