

A MESSAGE FROM OUR RABBI

Celebrating Israel's Independence

Given the difficult situation that Israel is in this year, many have asked: How can we celebrate Purim? How can we celebrate Pesach? Yet we did – for our sake, for Israel's sake, and for hope's sake for a better future

However, in May, we have more difficult questions: This year, how do we celebrate Israel Independence Day – Yom Ha-atzmaut? This year, what will Israel Memorial Day – Yom Hazikaron – the day before Israel Independence Day – be like?

With the ongoing battles against Hamas in Gaza, the threats from Iran's proxies to the north and south of Israel and now the threats of more attacks from Iran itself, how can Israel find it within itself to celebrate Yom Ha-atzmaut, which normally has festivals, picnics, barbeques, concerts, fireworks, air force flyovers, and more?

The Israelis will have to determine the answer to these questions. Whatever and however they develop their answers, we need to support them.

Yom Ha-atzmaut is usually observed on 5 Iyar. This year it is being observed on 6 Iyar due to the previous date's proximity to Shabbat (allowing Yom Hazikaron to start on Sunday night and not on Saturday night immediately after the end of Shabbat). So this year, Israel Independence Day will fall on May 14 (starting on the night before) which is the anniversary of Israel's Independence on the secular calendar. It will be 76 years from May 14, 1948 to May 14, 2024. Note that the Jewish Calendar works in 19-year cycles so that the Jewish date and the secular date will coincide every 19 years (sometimes being off by one day). This year for Israel is $76 = 19 \times 4$.

Our concern for Israel is constant – in its mourning and in its celebrating. We, too, can mourn the losses, celebrate the victories and the miracles of Israel's existence, and express our hopes and prayers for a better future going forward. We can also act in ways that support Israel and Israelis – donating to the Jewish Federation of Ocean County Israel Emergency Campaign and other charities doing the necessary work in Israel and keeping in contact with people we know in Israel showing them that they are not alone.

May Israel and all of us continue to celebrate!

Yom Hashoah Candle app

If you do not have a Yellow Candle for Yom HaShoah, you can download the free Shoah Yellow CandleTM phone app for iPhones or Androids. The phone app, managed by the Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs, is a practical and informal educational tool to remember Holocaust victims on Yom HaShoah, International Holocaust Remembrance Day (January 27 every year), or any day which the user has personal remembrance events such as Yahrzeits for family or friends.

FJMC created the phone app for those living in areas where candles cannot be lit, such as apartments, nursing homes, college dorms, etc. You may be out of town and cannot light the candle at home, or you may not have a candle, and you want to light one.

and can be downloaded for free.

- The app has many features and functions:
- The featured candle is an image of the Yom HaShoah candle.
- A flame appears when you touch the book of matches that states the word light.
- You can light for Yom HaShoah, on International Holocaust Remembrance Day, or for a remembrance for any occasion at any time.
- You can schedule a light for specific dates in the future, and the app will send you a reminder.
- You can Donate to the FJMC Holocaust Fund
- Explanations of why to light
- Recite a prayer with audio added so you also hear the prayer.

The digital 'lighting' of such candles, whenever the date is set, will 'burn' for 24 hours, and then the app will inform the user that the light is extinguished. The digital flame will not harm your phone.

Be Prepared – **CERT is Community Emergency Response Team,** a nationwide volunteer organization which most towns have. It backs up First Responders. Members are trained on what to do before, during and after a disaster, including basic first aid, CPR, fire safety, light search & rescue and triage. CERT members have assisted with evacuations, food & water distribution, fire and Super Storm Sandy as well as at township events, such as Summerfest, Night Against Crime and Trunk or Treat. When disaster strikes, those trained are able to assist the police and EMS, help themselves and

help their neighbors. Successful completion of a CERT course, which includes a written & practical test and background check, are the requirements to become a CERT member. Preparedness is very important. Please stop in the Temple Beth Or office, located in St. Thomas Lutheran Church, Monday-Friday, 9:00 AM – 1:00 PM to pick up a Disaster Preparedness Guide. If you are at any township event look for the CERT table and say hello. If you want to learn more, call our TBO member Joy Witt at 732-278-9008.
